After a swab has been taken, the sample is extracted and preserved in a powder, which holds the DNA indefinitely. The powder is then sent to loved ones in a decorative vial and can be returned to the lab at any point to have it genetically tested, which will reveal information about the essential makeup of the deceased person. Relatives can trace their ancestry back thousands of years using the data, and can also spot patterns of family health issues that may reveal their own risk of hereditary diseases.
